Big Idea: God extends His mercy with a final countdown before He judges the World.

What Jesus Says To A Faithful Church: 1. Be Bold <u>With Sharing The Good News</u>

"To the angel of the church in Philadelphia write: These are the words of Him who is **holy and true**, who holds the **key of David**. What **He opens** no one can shut, and what **He shuts** no one can open. I know your deeds. See, I have placed before you an **open door** that no one can shut." **Revelation 3:7-8a (NIV)**

"Devote yourselves to **prayer**, **being watchful** and **thankful**. And pray for us, too, that God may **open a door for our message**, so that we may **proclaim** the **mystery of Christ**, for which I am in chains. Pray that I may **proclaim it clearly**, as I should. **Be wise** in the way you act toward outsiders; make the most of every **opportunity**. Let your conversation be always **full of grace**, seasoned with salt, so that you may know **how to answer** everyone." **Colossians 4:2-6 (NIV)**

2. Be Dependent On God's Power

"I know that you have **little strength**, yet you have **kept my word** and have **not denied my name**. I will make those who are of the synagogue of Satan, who claim to be Jews though they are not, but are liars--I will make them come and fall down at your feet and **acknowledge that I have loved you**." **Revelation 3:8b-9 (NIV)**

"Indeed Herod and Pontius Pilate met together with the Gentiles and the people of Israel in this city to conspire against your holy servant Jesus, whom you anointed. **They did what your power and will had decided** beforehand should happen. Now, Lord, consider their threats and enable your servants to speak your word with great boldness. Stretch out your hand to heal and perform miraculous signs and wonders through the name of your holy servant Jesus." After they prayed, the place where they were meeting was shaken. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly." **Acts 4:27-31 (NIV)**

Paul's Testimony: "I **used** to **blaspheme** the name of Christ. In my insolence, I **persecuted** his people. But **God had mercy on me** because I did it in ignorance and unbelief. Oh, how **generous and gracious** our Lord was! He filled me with the **faith**

and love that come from Christ Jesus. This is a trustworthy saying, and everyone should accept it: "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners"—and I am the worst of them all. But God had mercy on me so that Christ Jesus could use me as a prime example of his great patience with even the worst sinners. Then others will realize that they, too, can believe in him and receive eternal life." 1 Timothy 1:13-17 (NLT2)

"For God chose to **save us** through our Lord Jesus Christ, not to pour out His anger on us. Christ died for us so that, whether we are dead or alive when He returns, we can **live with Him forever**." **1 Thessalonians 5:9-10 (NLT2)**

"We tell you this directly from the Lord: We who are still **living** when the **Lord returns** will not meet Him ahead of those who have **died**. For the Lord himself will come down from heaven with a commanding shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the **trumpet call** of God. First, the Christians who have died will **rise** from their graves. Then, **together** with them, we who are still alive and remain on the earth will be **caught up** in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. Then we will be with the Lord forever. So encourage each other with these words."
