# To Think The Best In My Relationships, I Need To:

## 1. Communicate Appreciation

"Paul and Timothy, servants of Christ Jesus, To all the saints in Christ Jesus at Philippi, together with the overseers and deacons: **Grace** and **peace** to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. **Philippians 1:1-2 (NIV)** 

Every time I think of you, I give thanks to my God. Whenever I pray, I make my requests for all of you with joy," Philippians 1:3-4 (NLT2)

"Don't just pretend to love others. Really **love** them. Hate what is wrong. Hold tightly to what is good. Love each other with genuine affection, and take delight in honoring each other." **Romans 12:9-10 (NLT2)** 

"And I am certain that God, who began the good work within you, will **continue** His work until it is finally finished on the day when Christ Jesus returns."

Philippians 1:6 (NLT2) Remember Verse

"So it is right that I should **feel** as I do about all of you, for you have a special place in my heart. You share with me the special favor of God, both in my **imprisonment** and in **defending and confirming** the truth of the Good News. God knows how much I **love** you and long for you with the **tender compassion** of Christ Jesus." **Philippians 1:7-8 (NLT2)** 

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# 2. Develop A "Team" Mentality Rather Then A "Job" Mentality

"for you have been my **partners** in spreading the Good News about Christ from the time you first heard it until now." **Philippians 1:5 (NLT2)** 

"Never speak harshly to an older man, but appeal to him **respectfully** as you would to your own father. Talk to younger men as you would to your own brothers. Treat older women as you would your mother, and treat younger women with all purity as

you would your own sisters. Take care of any widow who has no one else to care for her. But if she has children or grandchildren, their first responsibility is to **show godliness at home** and repay their parents by taking care of them. This is something that pleases God." **1 Timothy 5:1-4 (NLT2)** 

"Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves. Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others." **Philippians 2:3-4 (NIV)** 

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# 3. Commit To Kingdom Praying

"In all my prayers for all of you, I always **pray with joy."**Philippians 1:4 (NIV)

• Pray That They Make Wise Choices

For I want you to understand what really matters, so that you may live pure and blameless lives until the day of Christ's return. **Philippians 1:10 (NLT2)** 

• Pray That They Will <u>Have A Life-Changing Relationship With Jesus</u>
May you always be filled with the **fruit of your salvation**—the righteous character produced in your life by Jesus Christ—for this will bring much glory and praise to God." **Philippians 1:11 (NLT2)** 

"Therefore I, a prisoner for serving the Lord, beg you to lead a life **worthy** of your calling, for you have been called by God. Always be **humble and gentle**. Be **patient** with each other, **making allowance** for each other's faults because of your love. Make every effort to keep yourselves **united** in the Spirit, binding yourselves together with **peace**." **Ephesians 4:3 (NLT2)**
