## The Truth That Transforms: The Book Of Romans "The Truth About God's Sovereignty" Romans 9:1-33 Cornerstone Church of Poway Pastor Ed Turley September 12, 2021

Big Idea: If we want real life change, we must allow God's Word to transform us.

God's Sovereignty And Our Freewill: God is all wise, all powerful and has a divine plan to save the world. In the complexity of God's plan, He gave mankind the freedom and responsibility to make moral choices with blessings for obedience and painful consequences for disobedience. All of us have sinned and fallen short of God's holiness and are therefore unable to save ourselves. God being just and merciful sent His one and only son Jesus to pay for our sins upon the cross. God offers the gift of salvation through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. We have the responsibility to either accept or reject His gracious offer of salvation.

#### The Truth About God's Sovereignty:

#### 1. God Initiates His Divine Plan To Save The World Through The Jewish People

"For those God foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the likeness of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brothers. And those he predestined, he also called; those he called, he also justified; those he justified, he also glorified." **Romans 8:29-30 (NIV)** 

"I speak the truth in Christ--I am not lying, my conscience confirms it in the Holy Spirit--I have **great sorrow** and **unceasing anguish in my heart**. For I could wish that I myself were cursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of **my brothers**, those of **my own race**, **the people of Israel**. Theirs is the **adoption** as sons; theirs the **divine glory**, the covenants, the receiving of the law, the temple worship and **the promises**. Theirs are the patriarchs, and from them is traced the human **ancestry of Christ**, **who is God over all, forever praised!** Amen. **Romans 9:1-5 (NIV)** 

"It is not as though God's word had failed. For not all who are **descended** from Israel are Israel. Nor because they are his descendants are they all Abraham's **children**. On the contrary, "It is through **Isaac** that your **offspring** will be reckoned." In other words, it is not the natural children who are **God's children**, but it is the **children of the promise** who are regarded as Abraham's offspring. For this was how **the promise** was stated: "At the appointed time I will return, and Sarah will have a son." **Romans 9:6-9 (NIV)** 

Not only that, but **Rebekah's children** had one and the same father, our father Isaac. Yet, before the twins were born or had done anything good or bad--in order that God's purpose in **election** might stand: **not by works but by him who calls--she was told, "The older will serve the younger." Just as it is written: "Jacob I loved, but Esau I hated."** 

Romans 9:6-13 (NIV) [Malachi 1:1-5 – Two Nations: Jacob – Israel and Esau the Edomites.]

#### 2. Even When We Don't Understand, God Is Consistent With His Character

"What then shall we say? **Is God unjust? Not at all!** For he says to Moses, "I will have **mercy** on whom I have mercy, and I will have **compassion** on whom I have compassion."

It does not, therefore, depend on man's desire or effort, but on God's mercy. For the Scripture says to Pharaoh: "I raised you up for this very purpose, that I might display my power in you and that my name might be proclaimed in all the earth." Romans 9:14-17 (NIV)

Therefore God has mercy on whom he wants to have mercy, and he hardens whom he wants to harden. One of you will say to me: "Then why does God still blame us? For who resists his will?" But who are you, O man, to talk back to God? "Shall what is formed say to him who formed

it, 'Why did you make me like this?'" Does not the **potter** have the right to make out of the same **lump of clay** some pottery for **noble purposes** and some for **common use?** Romans 9:18-21 (NIV)

Do you think that I like to see wicked people die? says the Sovereign LORD.

Of course not! I want them to turn from their wicked ways and live. Ezekiel 18:23 (NLT2)

Don't tear your clothing in your grief, but tear your hearts instead." Return to the LORD your God, for he is merciful and compassionate, slow to get angry and filled with unfailing love. He is eager to relent and not punish. **Joel 2:13 (NLT2)** 

Or do you show contempt for the riches of His kindness, tolerance and patience, not realizing that God's kindness leads you toward repentance? But because of your stubbornness and your unrepentant heart, you are storing up wrath against yourself for the day of God's wrath, when his righteous judgment will be revealed. God "will give to each person according to what he has done." To those who by persistence in doing good seek glory, honor and immortality, he will give eternal life. But for those who are self-seeking and who reject the truth and follow evil, there will be wrath and anger. There will be trouble and distress for every human being who does evil: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile; but glory, honor and peace for everyone who does good: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile.

For God does not show favoritism. Romans 2:4-11 (NIV)

The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. He is patient with you, not wanting **anyone** to perish, but **everyone** to come to repentance. **2 Peter 3:9 (NIV)** 

#### 3. God Offers Salvation Through Faith

What if God, choosing to show his wrath and make his power known, bore with great patience the objects of his wrath--prepared for destruction? What if he did this to make the riches of his glory known to the objects of his mercy, whom he prepared in advance for glory-- even us, whom he also called, not only from the Jews but also from the Gentiles? As he says in Hosea: "I will call them 'my people' who are not my people; and I will call her 'my loved one' who is not my loved one," and, "It will happen that in the very place where it was said to them, 'You are not my people,' they will be called 'sons of the living God."

Romans 9:22-26 (NIV)

Isaiah cries out concerning Israel: "Though the number of the Israelites be like the sand by the sea, only the remnant will be saved. For the Lord will carry out his sentence on earth with speed and finality." It is just as Isaiah said previously: "Unless the Lord Almighty had left us descendants, we would have become like Sodom, we would have been like Gomorrah."

What then shall we say? That the Gentiles, who did not pursue righteousness, have obtained it, **a righteousness that is by faith**; but Israel, who pursued a law of righteousness, has not attained it. **Why not?** Because they **pursued it not by faith** but as if it were **by works**. They stumbled over the "**stumbling stone**." As it is written: "See, I lay in Zion a stone that causes men to stumble and a rock that makes them fall, and **the one who trusts in him will never be put to shame."** 

Romans 9:27-33 (NIV)

For it is **by grace** you have been saved, **through faith-**-and this not from yourselves, it is the **gift** of God-- not by works, so that no one can boast. **Ephesians 2:8-9 (NIV)**
