Big Idea: At the heart of Christmas, we find hope, peace, joy, and love in Jesus.

The people who walk in darkness Will see a great light; Those who live in a dark land, The light will shine on them. You shall multiply the nation, You shall increase their gladness; They will be glad in Your presence <u>As with</u> the gladness of harvest, As men rejoice when they divide the spoil. Isaiah 9:2-3 (NASB)

1. Walking By Faith, Not By Feelings

"In the time of Herod king of Judea there was a **priest** named **Zechariah**, who belonged to the priestly division of Abijah; his wife **Elizabeth** was also a descendant of Aaron. Both of them were **upright** in the sight of God, observing all the Lord's commandments and regulations **blamelessly."** Luke 1:5-6 (NIV)

"But they had **no children**, because Elizabeth was barren; and they were both well along in years. Once when Zechariah's division was **on duty** and he was serving as priest before God, he was **chosen** by lot, according to the custom of the priesthood, to go into the temple of the Lord and **burn incense**." **Luke 1:7-9 (NIV)**

2. Gathering People Of Faith Around Us

"And when the time for the burning of incense came, all the **assembled worshipers** were praying outside. Then an angel of the Lord appeared to him, standing at the right side of the altar of incense. When Zechariah saw him, **he was startled and was gripped with fear**. But the angel said to him: "Do not be afraid, Zechariah; your **prayer** has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you are to give him the name John." **Luke 1:10-13 (NIV)**

"He will be a **joy** and delight to you, and many will rejoice because of his birth, for he will be great in the sight of the Lord. He is never to take wine or other fermented drink, and he will be **filled with the Holy Spirit** even from birth. <u>Many of the people</u> of Israel will he **bring back** to the Lord their God. And he will go on before the Lord, in the **spirit and power of Elijah**, to **turn the hearts** of the **fathers** to their children and the **disobedient** to the wisdom of the righteous--to **make ready** a people prepared for the Lord." **Luke 1:14-17 (NIV)**

3. Trusting In God's Timing

Zechariah asked the angel, "How can I be sure of this? I am an old man and my wife is well along in years." The angel answered, "I am Gabriel. I stand in the presence of God, and I have been sent to speak to you and to tell you this good news. And now you will be silent and not able to speak until the day this happens, because you did not believe my words, which will come true at their proper time." Luke 1:18-20 (NIV)

Meanwhile, the people were waiting for Zechariah and **wondering why he stayed so long** in the temple. When he came out, he could not speak to them. They realized he had seen a vision in the temple, for he kept making signs to them but remained unable to speak. When his time of service was completed, he returned home. After this his wife Elizabeth became pregnant and for five months remained in seclusion. "The Lord has done this for me," she said. "In these days he has shown his **favor** and **taken away my disgrace** among the people." **Luke 1:21-25 (NIV)**
