As Jesus went on from there, he saw a man named **Matthew** sitting at the tax collector's booth. "**Follow me**," he told him, and Matthew got up and followed him. While Jesus was having dinner at Matthew's house, many tax collectors and "sinners" came and ate with him and his disciples. When the Pharisees saw this, they asked his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and 'sinners'?" On hearing this, Jesus said, "It is not the **healthy** who need a doctor, but the **sick**. But go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners." **Matthew 9:9-13 (NIV)**

# We Connect With Grace Filled Relationships By:

# 1. Creating A Welcoming Atmosphere

May God, who gives this patience and encouragement, help you **live in complete harmony** with each other, as is fitting for **followers of Christ Jesus**. Then all of you can join together with **one voice**, giving praise and glory to God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. **Therefore**, **accept each other just as Christ has accepted you** so that God will be given glory. Remember that Christ came as a **servant** to the Jews to show that God is true to the promises He made to their ancestors. He also came so that the Gentiles might give glory to God for his **mercies** to them. That is what the psalmist meant when he wrote:

"For this, I will praise you among the Gentiles; I will sing praises to your name." Romans 15:5-9 (NLT2)

# 2. Going Beyond The Superficial To Deeper Relationships

Let us hold tightly without wavering to the **hope** we affirm, for God can be trusted to keep His promise. Let us think of ways to motivate one another to acts of love and good works. And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another, especially now that the day of his return is drawing near. **Hebrews 10:23-25 (NLT2)** 

Every time I think of you, I give thanks to my God. Whenever I pray, I make my requests for all of you with joy, for you have been my partners in spreading the Good News about Christ from the time you first heard it until now. And I am certain that God, who began the good work within you, will continue his work until it is finally finished on the day when Christ Jesus returns.

# 3. Joining A Local Church

**Ephesians 2:19-22 (NLT2)** 

All the believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, and to fellowship, and to sharing in meals (including the Lord's Supper), and to prayer.

Acts 2:42 (NLT2)

They worshiped together at the Temple each day, met in homes for the Lord's Supper, and shared their meals with great joy and generosity— all the while praising God and enjoying the goodwill of all the people. And each day the Lord added to their fellowship those who were being saved.
