All of us used to live that way, following the passionate desires and inclinations of our sinful nature. By our very nature we were subject to God's anger, just like everyone else. But God is so rich in mercy, and he loved us so much, that even though we were dead because of our sins, He gave us life when he raised Christ from the dead. (It is only by God's grace that you have been saved!). **Ephesians 2:3-5 (NLT2)**

Big Idea: God's redemptive power removes our sins and calls us to return to Him.

And we know that God causes everything to work together for the good of those who love God and are called according to his purpose for them. **Romans 8:28 (NLT2)**

How To Embrace God's Redemptive Power:

1. Work On Myself by Changing One Defect at a Time

"An intelligent person aims at wise action, but a fool starts off in many directions." **Proverbs 17:24 (TEV)**

And I am certain that God, who began the good work within you, will continue his work until it is finally finished on the day when Christ Jesus returns. **Philippians 1:6 (NLT2)**

"Continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God who works in you to will and to act according to His good purpose." **Philippians 2:12-13 (NIV)**

3. Believe In Marriage Breakthroughs

Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you. **Ephesians 4:32 (NIV)**

This means that anyone who belongs to Christ has become a new person. The old life is gone; a new life has begun! And all of this is a gift from God, who brought us back to himself through Christ. And God has given us this task of reconciling people to him. For God was in Christ, reconciling the world to himself, no longer counting people's sins against them. And he gave us this wonderful message of reconciliation. So we are Christ's ambassadors; God is making his appeal through us. We speak for Christ when we plead, "Come back to God!" 21 For God made Christ, who never sinned, to be the offering for our sin, so that we could be made right with God through Christ.
